Students' Feedback Analysis Report (Academic Session 2020-21)

Executive Summary:

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted a comprehensive survey to collect feedback from students. A total of 408 responses were received. The data was collected through a survey where students were asked to rate various aspects of the college on a scale of 1 (Poor) to 5 (Excellent). The aspects include teaching quality, facilities, infrastructure, and the overall learning experience. The data collected from students' responses, categorized into 15 criteria/statements, has been analyzed, and this report summarizes the findings, identifies strengths, and highlights areas for improvement.




Fig 1: Criteria wise response of students

The criteria-wise analysis of student feedback is presented here. This analysis is crucial for understanding the strengths and areas that need improvement.

1) Infrastructural Facilities:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 64 + 158 = 222

Satisfactory Ratings: 85

Average and Poor Ratings: 93 + 8 = 101

Analysis: While a significant number of students appreciate the infrastructural facilities, there's a notable concern raised by 101 students. Addressing maintenance and expanding facilities could enhance the overall experience.

2) Cultural and Co-curricular Activities:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 75 + 152 = 227

Satisfactory Ratings: 79

Average and Poor Ratings: 79 + 23 = 102

Analysis: The college has a strong foundation in cultural and co-curricular activities, but improvements can be made to engage those who provided lower ratings. Expanding and diversifying activities may be beneficial.

3) Relevance of Courses:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 96 + 144 = 240

Satisfactory Ratings: 81

Average and Poor Ratings: 76 + 11 = 87

Analysis: The majority find the courses relevant, but there is room for improvement. Regularly updating courses based on industry trends and engaging students in curriculum development discussions can enhance relevance.

4) Quality of Teaching:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 142 + 157 = 299

Satisfactory Ratings: 63

Average and Poor Ratings: 41 + 5 = 46

Analysis: The quality of teaching is generally high, but addressing concerns raised by 46 students and providing continuous professional development opportunities could further elevate the teaching standards.

5) E-Learning and Online Teaching:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 68 + 127 = 195

Satisfactory Ratings: 76

Average and Poor Ratings: 86 + 51 = 137

Analysis: There's a significant concern regarding E-Learning and Online Teaching. Improving the quality and accessibility of online resources is essential for a more effective online education system.

6) Library Facilities:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 98 + 146 = 244

Satisfactory Ratings: 79

Average and Poor Ratings: 66 + 19 = 85

Analysis: The library facilities are appreciated, but addressing concerns about accessibility and maintenance can enhance the overall experience.

7) Course Curriculum:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 76 + 157 = 233

Satisfactory Ratings: 89

Average and Poor Ratings: 73 + 13 = 86

Analysis: The course curriculum is generally well received, but there's room for improvement. Regular reviews and updates, along with student involvement, can make it more engaging.

8) Enhancement of Knowledge and Skills:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 101 + 164 = 265

Satisfactory Ratings: 83

Average and Poor Ratings: 50 + 10 = 60

Analysis: A majority appreciates the enhancement of knowledge and skills but addressing concerns of 60 students can lead to more inclusive skill development opportunities.

9) Overall Personality Development:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 117 + 132 = 249

Satisfactory Ratings: 70

Average and Poor Ratings: 66 + 23 = 89

Analysis: While the efforts toward personality development are acknowledged,

addressing concerns can make these programs more effective for all students.

10) Syllabus Coverage:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 105 + 144 = 249

Satisfactory Ratings: 85

Average and Poor Ratings: 57 + 17 = 74

Analysis: The syllabus coverage is generally appreciated, but maintaining a balance and

ensuring coverage of relevant topics is essential.

11) Regularity and Punctuality of Teachers:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 147 + 156 = 303

Satisfactory Ratings: 65

Average and Poor Ratings: 33 + 7 = 40

Analysis: The regularity and punctuality of teachers are strong points, and efforts can be

made to maintain and encourage these positive practices.

12) Opportunities for Learning and Growth:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 107 + 156 = 263

Satisfactory Ratings: 73

Average and Poor Ratings: 54 + 18 = 72

Analysis: The college provides ample opportunities for learning and growth, but

addressing concerns raised by 72 students can make these opportunities more

accessible.

13) Evaluation System:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 123 + 151 = 274

Satisfactory Ratings: 79

Average and Poor Ratings: 46 + 9 = 55

Analysis: While the evaluation system is generally well-received, continuous efforts to

ensure transparency and fairness are essential.

14) Examination System:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 150 + 155 = 305

Satisfactory Ratings: 61

Average and Poor Ratings: 31 + 11 = 42

Analysis: The examination system is strong, and continuous improvement based on

student feedback is essential.

15) Comparative Rating:

Excellent and Good Ratings: 169 + 146 = 315

Satisfactory Ratings: 54

Average and Poor Ratings: 31 + 8 = 39

Analysis: The college is highly rated in comparison to others, reflecting a positive image.

Executive Summary:

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducted a comprehensive survey to collect feedback from faculty members. A total of 83 responses were received. The faculty members were asked to rate various aspects of the college on a scale of 1 (Poor) to 5 (Excellent). The aspects include balance between theory and application in courses/syllabi, objectives of the syllabi, relevance of prescribed materials, freedom for diverse teaching approaches, freedom for testing and assessment, teaching-research environment, administration, support for faculty development and ICT facilities in the college. The data collected has been analyzed, and this report summarizes the findings, identifies strengths, and highlights areas for improvement.




Fig 1: Percentage response to criteria 1-6 (inner to outer circle)




Fig 1: Percentage response to criteria 7-13 (inner to outer circle)

The criteria-wise analysis of teachers' feedback is presented here. This analysis is crucial for understanding the strengths and areas that need improvement.

- 1) The courses/syllabi taught by me have a good balance between theory and application: The majority of teachers (70%) find that the courses/syllabi have a good balance between theory and application, with 58 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 2) **The objectives of the syllabi are well defined:** The majority of teachers (77%) believe that the objectives of the syllabi are well defined, with 64 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 3) The books/journals prescribed are relevant, updated, and cover the entire syllabi: Most teachers (69%) find the prescribed books/journals relevant, updated, and covering the entire syllabi, with 57 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 4) The course/syllabi of the subjects taught by me increased my interest, knowledge, and perspective in the subject area: A significant number of teachers (76%) feel that the course/syllabi have increased their interest, knowledge, and perspective in the subject area, with 63 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 5) Freedom of teaching, such as group discussions, student seminar presentations, and learners' participation: A majority of teachers (69%) believe that the college provides them with full freedom of teaching, with 57 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 6) Freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies for testing and assessment of students: Most teachers (80%) feel that they have the freedom to adopt new techniques/strategies for testing and assessment, with 54 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 7) Tests and examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units in the syllabus: A majority of teachers (70%) believe that tests and examinations are conducted well in time with proper coverage of all units, with 57 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 8) The prescribed books are available in the library: While most teachers (59%) find the availability of prescribed books in the library good or excellent, there is room for improvement as 5% rated it as poor or very poor.
- 9) The environment in the College is conducive to teaching and research: While the majority of teachers (73%) find the environment conducive to teaching and research, there is a notable portion (12%) that rated it as poor or very poor.
- 10) **The administration is teacher-friendly:** Most teachers (73%) believe that the administration is teacher-friendly, with 57 teachers rating it as excellent.
- 11) The college provides adequate opportunities and support for faculty members for upgrading their skills and qualifications: The majority of teachers (72%) feel that the college provides adequate opportunities and support for upgrading their skills and qualifications, with 58 teachers rating it as excellent.

- 12) **ICT facilities in the college are adequate and satisfactory:** While a significant portion of teachers (67%) find the ICT facilities adequate and satisfactory, there is room for improvement as 14% rated it as poor or very poor.
- 13) The classrooms are clean and well-maintained: Most teachers (74%) believe that the classrooms are clean and well-maintained, with 52 teachers rating it as excellent.

Suggestion for improvement

Based on the feedback provided by the teachers, here are a few points for improvement.

- 1) Enhance Availability of Prescribed Books: Some teachers (5%) indicated that the availability of prescribed books in the library is poor or very poor. The college should focus on ensuring a sufficient stock of prescribed books in the library, addressing any gaps or outdated materials. Regular updates and acquisitions can contribute to a more resourceful environment for both faculty and students.
- 2) **Improve College Environment:** A notable portion of teachers (12%) expressed concerns about the college environment being less conducive to teaching and research. Initiatives to improve the overall atmosphere, facilities, and resources within the college can be undertaken. This may include investing in infrastructure maintenance, creating collaborative spaces, and fostering a positive and inspiring academic culture.
- 3) **Upgrade ICT Facilities:** Noticeably 14% of teachers found the ICT facilities to be inadequate or unsatisfactory. The college should consider upgrading its ICT infrastructure to meet the evolving technological needs of both faculty and students. This may involve investing in modern equipment, software, and ensuring reliable internet connectivity to support effective teaching, learning, and research.
- 4) Address Concerns in Classroom Maintenance: A small percentage of teachers (3%) expressed dissatisfaction with the cleanliness and maintenance of classrooms. Implementing regular cleaning schedules, maintenance checks, and addressing any reported issues promptly can contribute to a more comfortable and conducive learning environment. Involving faculty and students in maintaining the cleanliness of shared spaces can also foster a sense of ownership.
- 5) Continuous Professional Development for Administration: While the majority of teachers (73%) perceive the administration as teacher-friendly, there is room for improvement. Continuous professional development programs for administrative staff can help in creating a more supportive and efficient administrative environment. This may include training in effective communication, conflict resolution, and understanding the specific needs of faculty members.

Conclusion

In summary, Udai Pratap College receives positive feedback from teachers across various criteria. However, attention may be needed in areas such as the availability of prescribed books in the library, the college environment, and the adequacy of ICT facilities. Continuous improvement efforts in these areas can contribute to an even more positive teaching and learning environment.




Fig 1: Criteria wise response of parents

Excellent and Good Ratings: 114 + 108 = 222

Satisfactory Ratings: 44

Poor and Very Poor Ratings: 29 + 23 = 52

Analysis: The majority of parents are satisfied with the admission procedure. However, addressing concerns from 52 respondents is important. Improving transparency and communication during the admission process can enhance satisfaction.

2) Infrastructure and Lab Facility (बुनियादी ढांचा और प्रयोगशाला सुविधा):

7) Student Counseling and Guidance (छात्रों को परामर्श और मार्गदर्शन):

Excellent and Good Ratings: 107 + 97 = 204

Satisfactory Ratings: 56

Poor and Very Poor Ratings: 32 + 26 = 58

Analysis: While counseling and guidance receive positive feedback, addressing concerns from 58 respondents is crucial. Enhancing support services can contribute to overall satisfaction.

8) Use of Information and Communication Technology in College (महाविद्यालय में सूचना और संचार तकनीकी का प्रयोग):

Excellent and Good Ratings: 106 + 91 = 197

10) Examination System Adopted by the College (महाविद्यालय की परीक्षा प्रणाली):

Excellent and Good Ratings: 141 + 103 = 244

Satisfactory Ratings: 30

Poor and Very Poor Ratings: 22 + 22 = 44

Analysis: The examination system receives positive feedback. However, addressing concerns from 44 respondents is essential. Continuous improvement and transparency in the examination system are recommended.

This analysis provides actionable insights for the college to focus on areas that need improvement and build upon strengths. Continuous efforts in addressing concerns and enhancing various aspects will contribute to the overall satisfaction and positive perception of Udai Pratap

College among parents.
