UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI, a society under the Societies Registration Act — 1860, having its registered office in/at UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI 221002, hereinafter referred to as UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI (which expression shall where the context so admits include its successors and permitted assigns) of the OTHER PART; WHEREAS DBT being desirous of capacity building in the area Biotechnology teaching decided to support U.G. teaching in four departments of science (Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology) under STAR STATUS SCHEME DBT submitted by UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI for the attainment of the objectives, herein after described in the Annexure I annexed hereto;

This Memorandum of Agreement (MoA) defines the role and responsibilities of the participating agencies, monitoring and other matters related to the U.G. teaching in four departments of science (Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology) under STAR STATUS SCHEME DBT.

NOW THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:-

## 1.0. ROLE OF DEPARTMENT OF BIOTECHNOLOGY, NEW DELHI

To provide funds to the extent of Rs. 12600000.00 (One Hundred Twenty Six Lacs) over a period of three years from the date of sanction of the project, 19.09.2019 for undertaking activities under DBT STAR COLLEGE SCHEME as detailed in Annexure A. Details of the funds to be provided are given in Annexure II and III.

ROLE OF UDAI PRATAP (AUTONOMOUS) COLLEGE VARANASI (Histitute/NGO/College).

To accomplish and fulfill the terms and conditions listed at Annexure II.

- 2.3. To submit an annual audited statement of expenditure incurred under the programme.
- 2.4. To ensure effective utilization of the grant given by DBT for the purpose for which it was granted and to ensure timely completion of course work/project work/examination.
- 2.5. UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI will take up all liabilities of the teaching programme including manpower, both scientific and non-scientific, after completion of the sanction period specified in the sanction order.

3.0 DURATION OF PROJECT

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#### RIGHTS 4.0 OF OWNERSHIP/TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER AND UTILIZATION

- All the assets including the equipment and produce acquired will be property of 4.1 DBT and shall not be utilized for the purposes other than teaching/capacity building at UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI. The rights of DBT under this MOA shall not be transferred to any party without prior approval in writing of DBT.
- It shall be the responsibility of UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) 4.2 VARANASI to ensure that support of DBT is suitably acknowledged in the publications (papers, reports, etc.) arising out of the programme.

#### MONITORING 5.

- 5.1 The progress of implementation of the programme and proper utilization of grant shall be reviewed by the DBT and by the Advisory Committee set up by UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI
- 5.2 The periodic progress of physical achievements and the utilization of funds, statement of expenditure shall be evaluated by the Advisory Committee and DBT-UGC Task Force on HRD.
- 5.3 The Comptroller and Auditor General of India, at his discretion shall have the right of access to the books and accounts of UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS) VARANASI for the grants received from DBT for this project.
- 5.4 The DBT may terminate the grant at any stage if it is convinced that the grant has not been properly utilized or appropriate progress has not been made. ## TERMS & CONDITIONS OF THE GRANT

(To be signed and enclosed with concern filled proforma)

- 1. Approval of the Research proposal and the grant released would be for the specific project mentioned in paras I to V of this proposal and grant should be exclusively spent on the project for which it has been sanctioned within the stipulated time. The Institute is not permitted to seek or utilise funds from any other organisation (Government, Semi Government, Autonomous or Private) for this research project. Any unspent part of amount would be surrendered to the Govt. of India through an account payee demand draft drawn in favour of the "Drawing and Disbursing Officer, Department of Biotechnology, New Delhi", and carry forward of funds of the next financial year for utilization for the same project may be considered only with the specific approval of the Department of Biotechnology (DBT).
- 2. For permanent/semi-permanent assets acquired solely or mainly out of the grant, an audited record in the form of a register in the prescribed proforma (enclosed at Appendix-'A') shall be maintained by the Institute. The term "assets" means (I) immovable property and (II) movable property of a capital nature, where the value exceeds Rs. 1000/- The grant will not be utilised for construction of any immovable property, Full facilities by way of accommodation, etc. for the project will be given by the Institute.
- All the assets acquired from the grant will be the property of Govt. of India and should not without the prior sanction of the Deptt. of Biotechnology, be disposed of, or encumbered or utilised for purpose other than those for which the grant has been sanctioned.

At the conclusion of the project, the Govt. of India will be free to sell or otherwise dispose of assets which are the property of the Government. The Institute shall render to Govt. necessary facilities for arranging the sale / disposal of these assets. The Government may, however, consider the request of host institutions to retain the assets created under a project for carrying out similar work for the promotion of science.

The implementing Institute/PI will furnish progress report of work on the project every six months. The progress of the project will also be reviewed/monitored at least once a year by the concerned Task Force/Project Monitoring Committee, etc. In addition the DBT shall designate Scientists/Specialists to visit the Institute periodically for reviewing the progress of work and for suggesting such measures as to ensure early realisation of the objectives of the project. On completion of the project five copies of a consolidated report of the work done on the subject would be submitted to the Department of Biotechnology.

- The Institute is required to send to DBT a list of assets referred to at Sl. No. 2 above at the end of each financial year as well as at the time of seeking further installments of the grant.
- 7. The Institute would furnish to the Deptt. of Biotechnology a Utilization Certificate (Copy enclosed at Appendix 'B') and an audited statement of expenditure (Copy enclosed at Appendix 'C') duly signed by the P.I., the Head of the Institute and the Head of the Finance wing, pertaining to the grant at the end of each financial year as well as a consolidated statement of expenditure at the end of the completion of the project.
- A stamped receipt be sent to the Deptt. of Biotechnology on receipt of the Cheque/ Demand draft towards each release.

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- The Comptroller and Auditor-General of India at his discretion shall have the right of access to the books and accounts of the Institute for the grant received from the Government.
- 10. The Institute would maintain separate audited accounts for the project. If it is found expedient to keep a part or whole of the grant in a bank account earning interest, the interest thus earned should be reported to the Deptt. of Biotechnology.
- 11. Sale proceeds, if any, as a result of the development of the project arising directly from funds granted by the Deptt. of Biotechnology shall be reported to the Govt. of India. The Govt. of India may at its discretion allow a portion of such receipt to be retained by the Institute for its utilisation for the project activities.
- 12. Investigators/Institutes wishing to publish papers based on the research work done under Deptt. of Biotechnology projects should acknowledge the financial support received from the Deptt. of Biotechnology.
- 13. Investigators/Institutes may utilize various resources such as the Bioinformatics resources, experimental materials, reagents, cell lines, animals, etc. from the National facilities/Institutes/Centres established by this Department as per the terms of transactions followed by them. More information may be obtained about such facility from DBT websites: http://www.dbtindia.org// www.dbtindia.nic.in, www.btisnet.ac.in.
- 14. Investigators / Institutes shall follow the detailed instructions on technology transfer and Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) as given at Annexure V. The same has the approval of the Ministry of Finance, Govt. of India vide Deptt. of Expenditure, Plan Finance II Division Letter No. 33 (5) /PF.II/99 dated 22nd February, 2000. Any deviation from these instructions may be brought to the notice of this Department.

Investigators / Institutes may file patents with the help of the Biotechnology Patents Facilitating Cell (BPFC) established at DBT on priority bases. The format for filing the patents may be seen at Annexure –VI.

- 16. The Govt. of India (Deptt. of Biotechnology) will have the right to call for drawings, specifications and other data necessary to enable the transfer of know-how to other parties and the Institute shall supply all the needed information at the request of the Department of Biotechnology which will ensure confidentiality. The information required for commercializing Biotechnologies may be furnished to this Deptt. as per the format enclosed at Annexure VII. More information on commercialization can be found at the website www.ebc.nic.in.
- 17. The Institute may not entrust the implementation of the work for which the grant is being sanctioned to another institution and to divert the grant receipts as assistance to the latter institution. However, in such situations the express permission of DBT may be obtained. In case the grantee is not in a position to execute or complete the project, it may be required to refund forthwith to the Govt. of India (Department of Biotechnology) the entire amount of grant received by it.
- 18. The human resources that may be engaged for the project by the Institute are not to be treated as employees of the Govt. of India and the deployment of such human resource at the time of completion or termination of project, will not be the concern/responsibility of the Govt. of India. The Organisation may make

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reservations for Scheduled Castes, Schedule Tribes etc. in the human resource to be engaged for the project in accordance with the instruction issued by the Govt. of India from time to time.



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



Post Graduate College, Malikpura, Ghazipur, Uttar Pradesh, India, an Institution affiliated to VBS Purvanchal University, Jaunpur (UP), recognized by UGC under Section 12 B & 2f of the UGC Act, 1956, having its registered office at Malikpura, Ghazipur and represented by its Principal **Dr. Diwakar Singh** hereinafter referred to as 'PGC Malikpura' (which expression shall, where the context so admits, mean and include its successors, lawful representatives and permitted assigns) of the Second Party (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties" and individually as "the Party"). WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:-

UPC and PGC MALIKPURA have many areas of common interest in academic, education and research such as Social Science, Humanities and Commerce considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education and research, and administrative.

#### 1. Objectives

### 3. Exchange of Faculty and Staff

UPC and PGC MALIKPURA agree to encourage collaboration between faculty and staff from the two institutions. Specifically, institutions will encourage members of their faculties to undertake short visits to, or take up fixed-term visiting assignments at, each other's institution as per the existing norms. Notwithstanding the above, UPC and PGC MALIKPURA will examine ways to identify financial resources to fund international travel by their faculty/students.

### 4. Student Exchange

UPC and PGC MALIKPURA agree that student exchange will be guided by principles listed below. A home institution refers to the institution where a student is a full-time student, and from where he/she is expected to graduate. A host institution refers to an institution that receives a student for a brief period of time to undertake a pre-determined programme of study or research.

- 4.1 Exchange students will be selected by mutual agreement between the home institution and the host institution.
- 4.2 An exchange student will continue to be treated as full-time student at his/her home institution.
- 4.3 An exchange student will be considered as full-time "exchange" student at the host institution.
- 4.4 His/her programme of study at the host institution will be determined by mutual consultation between his/her academic advisor at the home institution and his/her "interim" academic advisor identified by the host institution.
- 4.5 The host institution will evaluate an exchange student's performance in each course or module, award a letter grade or marks, and issue a letter to that effect.
- 4.6 The home institution may award to the exchange student credits earned at a host institution, but only after the home institution has established correspondence between courses taken at the host institution vis-a-vis those offered at the home institution.
- 4.7 If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the host institution will evaluate the exchange student's performance in the research, and issue a letter to that effect, together with a technical "report" of the research carried out.
- 4.8 If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the home institution will take note of the performance evaluation and the technical report, and take steps in accordance with its own procedures.
- 4.9 To avail travel expenses, students can apply for existing funding programs at their respective home institution.
- 4.10 The exchange students will pay tuition and other fees at their home institution.

## 5. Exchange of Scientific and Technical Material

UPC and PGC MALIKPURA will exchange information on research and educational programmes and teaching/learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programmes. Further, UPC and PGC MALIKPURA agree to explore ways to share teaching/learning material, and other relevant literature, while respecting each other's intellectual property and other rights.

# 6. Joint Conferences, workshops and short-term courses

Prasad "Deen"** hereinafter referred to as 'DoBMU' (which expression shall, where the context so admits, mean and include its successors, lawful representatives and permitted assigns) of the Second Party (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties" and individually as "the Party"). WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS: -

UPC and DoBMU have many areas of common interest in academic, education and research such as Sciences, Social Science, and Humanities considerable advantage may be gained from their pursuit on a collaborative basis in the fields of academics, education and research, and administrative.

## 4. Student Exchange

UPC and DoBMU agree that student exchange will be guided by principles listed below. A home institution refers to the institution where a student is a full-time student, and from where he/she is expected to graduate. A host institution refers to an institution that receives a student for a brief period of time to undertake a pre-determined programme of study or research.

- 4.1 Exchange students will be selected by mutual agreement between the home institution and the host institution.
- 4.2 An exchange student will continue to be treated as full-time student at his/her home institution.
- 4.3 An exchange student will be considered as full-time "exchange" student at the host institution.
- 4.4 His/her programme of study at the host institution will be determined by mutual consultation between his/her academic advisor at the home institution and his/her "interim" academic advisor identified by the host institution.
- 4.5 The host institution will evaluate an exchange student's performance in each course or module, award a letter grade or marks, and issue a letter to that effect.
- 4.6 The home institution may award to the exchange student credits earned at a host institution, but only after the home institution has established correspondence between courses taken at the host institution vis-a-vis those offered at the home institution.
- 4.7 If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the host institution will evaluate the exchange student's performance in the research, and issue a letter to that effect, together with a technical "report" of the research carried out.

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- 4.8 If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the home institution will take note of the performance evaluation and the technical report, and take steps in accordance with its own procedures.
- 4.9 To avail travel expenses, students can apply for existing funding programs at their respective home institution.
- 4.10 The exchange students will pay tuition and other fees at their home institution.

# 5. Exchange of Scientific and Technical Material

UPC and DoBMU will exchange information on research and educational programmes and teaching/learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programmes. Further, UPC and DoBMU agree to explore ways to share teaching/learning material, and other relevant literature, while respecting each other's intellectual property and other rights.

# 6. Joint Conferences, workshops and short-term courses

UPC and DoBMU agree to help identify and invite faculty members from the other institution to participate in conferences, workshops and short-term courses. The terms and conditions for such participation will be worked out by mutual agreement between UPC and DoBMU.

## 7. Intellectual Property

UPC and DoBMU agree to respect each other's rights to intellectual property. Further, the intellectual property rights that arise as a result of any collaborative research or activity under this MoU will be worked out on a case-by-case basis, and will be consistent with the officially laid down IPR policies of the two institutions.

#### 8. Tenure and Termination

This MoU will take effect from the date it is signed by representatives of the two institutions. It will remain valid for five years, and may be continued thereafter after suitable review and agreement. Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice to the other institution six months in advance. Once terminated, neither UPC nor DoBMU will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. However, both the institutions will ensure that all activities in progress are allowed to complete successfully.

- 7.3 The expenditure incurred and to be incurred for the maintenance of IPR shall be borne by each party equally or in proportion to the extent of ownership as may be decided by authorized authorities of both the institutions mutually.
- 7.4 Publications, if any, in respect of the activities covered under this MOU shall be in the names of involved personnel from both parties with their mutual consent to share the authorship.
- 7.5 All ethical guidelines of research publication existent at both the Institutions will be followed strictly.

### 8. Financial Commitment

However, both parties agree that all continuing obligations to students, staff, funding bodies or other entities are met in full subsequent to the notice of termination.
- 9.3 Once terminated, neither party will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other party may suffer.

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#### 10. Arbitration Clause

- 10.1 Any dispute arising out of or in connection with this Memorandum of Understanding or relating to its enforcement will be resolved by the parties hereto amicably. However, if the dispute remains unresolved, it shall be referred to an Arbitrator to be appointed by mutual consent of both the parties.
- 10.2 The place of arbitration shall be at either of the institutes or a place mutually agreed upon, and the arbitration proceedings shall be as provided under the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The decision of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding upon both the parties.



The First party will recognize the Second party as a institute for conducting research and training and will seek joint ventures on collaborative research, training, project formulation & implementation. The Second party will recognize the First party as an Institute for conducting complete/ partial research related to the thesis requirement of the Post Graduate/research students for dissertation/Ph.D. degree. The Second party will recognize Scientists of the ICAR Institute as recommended by its Director in accordance with the University rules and regulations for guiding students working for the said degree. The training and research costs as prescribed by ICAR will be borne by faculty, staff, research scholars and students of second party.

Operational details of research effort and collaboration will be made in common research programmes and/or projects restricted to specific mandated domain within the approved disciplines/divisions.

Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with the both parties will be made available for the utilization of scientists, faculty, students and research scholars of both parties. However, the costs of specific consumables will be borne by the respective organizations.

There shall be an exchange of scientists, faculties, staff & students for academic, research and training purposes. Accommodation in the Hostel shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per the availability and on the prevailing rates. In the event of non-availability for any reason, the students will have to make their own arrangements for boarding and lodging. The duration of exchange visits will be determined by mutual consent between both the parties.

The second party shall take up joint research programs of mutual interest.

## Article 2. Management

The competent authorities of the First party and the Principal/ Dean Agriculture of the Second party will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.

The Advisory Committee will meet at least once in a year alternatively in the institutions of the First party and the Second party to review the activities. This meeting shall include presentation on the research, academic, project, extension and training activities, which should be open to the students, faculty and scientists.

## Article 3. Exchange of Information

Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.

Both parties understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.

Both parties acknowledge that exchange of scientists, faculty, staff and students from one party to the other shall be subject to the availability of funds and shall comply with the regulations and policies of the First party and the Second party.

A copy of the thesis/dissertation will be submitted to the First Party after the award of the degree by the Second Party.

All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. Disagreements at the operating level shall be forwarded to respective higher officials for appropriate resolution failing which an arbitrator of mutual acceptance may be identified for the settlement of dispute, if any.

All questions not foreseen related to this MoU will be handled by the parties by mutual agreement.

Nothing in this MoU is intended to affect other cooperation or collaborations between the parties.

## Article 5. Intellectual Property Rights

The Supervisor/Co-Supervisor/ Guide/Co-Guide of the student shall be the corresponding author for the publications depending upon the major work carried out at ICAR-IIVR/ UPC and reported in the dissertation/thesis/report.

Patent/IP, if any, shall be dependent on the major work that is carried out either in ICAR-IIVR or UPC. If the major work is carried out at ICAR-IIVR then, Patent/IP protection/registration will be done in the name of ICAR-IIVR as first owner/applicant and if the major work is carried out at UPC then, Patent/IP will be in the name of UPC as first owner/applicant. The work carried out by the students in ICAR-IIVR cannot be published anywhere without the knowledge of the concerned Supervisor/Co-Supervisor/ Guide/Co-Guide from both the parties.

## Article 6. Admission and Fees

Any interested bonafide M.Sc.(Ag) StudentPh.D. scholars of second party, if interested in conducting his/her dissertation/research work or want a short training at first party, must apply through proper channel as described by second party. The Director/Competent authority of first party upon request from competent authority of second party will allot External Supervisor/Co-Supervisor/Guide/Co-Guide/ contact scientist for the same.

Similarly, if any faculty member or trainee or student from first party wish to join second party for short training or part of their thesis work must apply through proper channel as described by first party. The Principal/ Dean Agriculture of second party will allocate Co-advisor/Guide/Co-Guide/ contact scientist for the same.

Admission of the students and the award of degrees for different programmes will be the responsibility of the second party as per the rules and regulations.

Allotment of the External Guide/ Co-Guides/ External Co-Supervisor from First party for Ph.D. research/training will be done by the approval of Director/competent authority of the First party.

- The number of faculty and student(s) at any particular time will be subject to the availability of research facilities and scientists' time to guide research at respective institutions.
- The PME Cell of the First party in consultation with the representative of the Second party shall decide the location and sharing quantum of research work.
- Any faculty or student admitted to the First party for training/postgraduate/doctoral research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the First party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such student(s) would be summarily terminated. The Second party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.
- Any scientist or research scholar admitted to the Second party for training research, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the Second party or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of the Institute, or cause damage to the property, the registration of such scientist/ research scholar would be summarily terminated. The First party will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such scientist/ research scholar until they compensate the losses to the Second party.
- Fees will be charged as described by the ICAR from the faculty or students of second partyby the first party to undertake training or to conduct research for their degree programmes/as trainees at first party.
- Fees will be charged as described by the ICAR/ competent authority of the second party from the faculty or students of first party by the second party to undertake training or to conduct research for their degree programmes as trainees at second party.

## Article7. Entry into effect, modification and termination

This MoU shall become effective on the date it is signed by the parties and shall be valid forfive years extendable up to ten years. Both parties shall review the status of the MoU at theend of each five years' period to determine any modification, whenever necessary. The period of validity of this MoU may be extended by mutual consent for up to ten years from the date of signing of the MoU. This MoU may be amended by mutual written agreement and may be terminated at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party initiating termination. ## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU)

## **BETWEEN**

## UDAI PRATAP COLLEGE, VARANASI, INDIA

## **AND**

## M/S Bharatarambh Initiatives, BHU, Varanasi

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MoU) is executed at Varanasi on this Twenty First day of May 2023 by and between Udai Pratap College, Varanasi, India, an Autonomous Institution affiliated to MGKVP, Varanasi; recognized by UGC under Section 12 B & 2f of the UGC Act, 1956, having its registered office at Varanasi-221002, India and represented by its Principal Dr. Dharmendra Kumar Singh hereinafter referred to as 'UPC'(which expression shall, where the context so admits, mean and include its successors, lawful representatives and permitted assigns) of the First Party;

and

M/S Bharatarambh Initiatives, a Company established and registered under The Companies Act 1956, having its registered office at 5<sup>th</sup> floor, CDC Building AIC, BHU, Varanasi and represented by its Director herein after referred to as M/S Bharatarambh Initiatives (which expression shall, where the context so admits, mean and include its successors, lawful representatives and permitted assigns) of the Second Party (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Parties" and individually as "the Party"). WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS:-

## **PURPOSE OF MOU**

In particular, this MOU is intended to

- 1. Enhance entrepreneurial mindsets among the students of UPC
- 2. Organize various workshops on Entrepreneurship Development
- 3. Conduct practical trainings on Skill and Entrepreneurship Development
- 4. Generate self-employment opportunities

- 5. Assist the students in establishing various start-ups
- 6. Arrange the placement of trained students

Considering their common interest in promoting the mutual cooperation in the area of, skill based training, education, research and Entrepreneurship Development; Desiring to expand the basis for academic and educational cooperation; and Pursuant to the prevailing laws and regulations in their respective areas/domain/jurisdictions, as well as the procedures and policy of the Government of India/Government of Uttar Pradesh concerning academic and educational cooperation;

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

## Clause 1

## **CO-OPERATION**

- 1.1 Both parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations. The parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
- 1.2 The co-operation between First Party and Second Party will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the Second Party providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching/ training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the First Party
- 1.3 The goal is to work towards an enriching collaboration between UPC and M/S Bharatarambh Initiatives', with a commitment to proffer an empowered human capital to the Nation which would be developed by the two parties through insightful exchange of technical training/ learning resources, technology scaffolds and immense caliber of the students, for which both the parties agree:

## Clause 2

## SCOPE OF THE MOU

- 2.1 Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be a major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
- 2.2 The Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching/ training methodology so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully. The two parties will jointly organize short-term training programmes on topics of mutual interest.

- 2.3 The interaction between Industry and UPC will give an insight into the latest developments /requirements of the industries; the Second Party to permit the Faculty and Students of the First Party to visit the company in groups and also involve them in Industrial Training Programs. The industrial training and exposure provided to students through this association will build confidence and prepare the students to have a smooth transition from academic to working career. The Second Party will provide its Labs/ Workshops/ Industrial Sites for the hands-on training of the learners enrolled with the First Party.
- 2.4 The Second Party will train the students of the First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the gap in skill and make them ready for industry.
- 2.5 The Second Party will extend the necessary support to deliver guest lecturers to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.6 The Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the training and placement of students of the First Party into internships/jobs.
- 2.7 UPC and M/S Bharatarambh Initiatives, will exchange information on research and educational programmes and teaching/learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programmes. Further, both the parties agree to explore ways to share teaching/learning material, and other relevant literature, while respecting each other's intellectual property and other rights and will be consistent with the officially laid down IPR policies of the two parties. The extent of ownership shall be decided mutually depending upon the relative level of intellectual inputs made by the parties. The expenditure incurred and to be incurred for the maintenance of IPR shall be borne by each party equally or in proportion to the extent of ownership as may be decided by authorized authorities of both the institutions mutually. Publications, if any, in respect of the activities covered under this MOU shall be in the names of involved personnel from both parties with their mutual consent to share the authorship. All ethical guidelines of research publication existent at both the Institutions will be followed strictly.
- 2.8 Both the parties further agree that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity identified above will be separately determined and agreed upon by the two parties. These terms shall include a technical description of the proposed activity, financial arrangements, and person(s) responsible for its implementation, etc.
- 2.9 This MoU, being a co-operative and collaborative understanding for academic excellence and enhancement of skill, shall not create any legal and / or financial commitment whatsoever on either of the parties hereto, except as may be provided in activity-specific agreement(s) that may be entered into subsequently.

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## Clause 3

## 3. Tenure and Termination

- 3.1 This Memorandum of Understanding will be in force for a period of five years from the date of signing of the same by authorized representatives of the two parties, and may be continued thereafter subject to such other terms, conditions and validity as may be mutually agreed upon.
- 3.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar days' by issuing a six months notice in writing to the other party prior to the desired termination date. However, both parties agree that all continuing obligations to students, staff, funding bodies or other entities are met in full subsequent to the notice of termination.
- 3.3 Once terminated, neither party will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other party may suffer.

## Clause 4

## 4. Arbitration

- 4.1 Any dispute arising out of or in connection with this Memorandum of Understanding or relating to its enforcement will be resolved by the parties hereto amicably. However, if the dispute remains unresolved, it shall be referred to an Arbitrator to be appointed by mutual consent of both the parties.
- 4.2 The place of arbitration shall be a place mutually agreed upon, and the arbitration proceedings shall be as provided under the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The decision of the Arbitrator shall be final and binding upon both the parties.
- 4.3 All legal disputes shall be subjected to the jurisdiction of the Courts in Varanasi.

This MoU is signed subject to approval of the respective academic/administrative bodies.
